church family and it is time to eliminate the speculation and gossip that will only increase divisiveness. Each of you can begin this healing process within yourselves and also by reaching out to others whose views on the future of our church may be different from your own.

Please join me in praying for our church, our church family and our minister. Listen to each other and ask for forgiveness. It is time to show compassion, empathy and support for one another. I cannot do this alone and pray each of you will take ownership and champion the rebuilding of love and trust in our church community.

In the coming weeks, I will keep you informed of what is happening. If you have any questions concerning the reviews or thoughts on how you can contribute to the contact me.

I also hope to call or have contact with each of you within the next few months as I begin my tenure as the new Chair of the Leadership Council to share my love for our church and congregation with you and to have you share your thoughts with me.

Stewardship Update

The following report shows the financial results to the end of July 2017. Results for the same year-to-date period in 2016 are also included below for comparison purposes.

As shown above, as of the end of the July programming and operating expenditures were more than revenue amounts from various sources, resulting in an operating deficit of \$48,359. Revenue amounts from various sources are less than amounts budgeted on a year-to-date basis, by approximately \$25K, primarily due to giving amounts being less than planned.

As shown above, the 2017 statement of sources of funds, includes givings received for Outreach and Capital and transferred to the Holding Fund accounts that are used to administer these funds. Such amounts weren't previously reported in the income statement, and as a result there aren't corresponding balances in the 2016 results shown above.

Thank you for your ongoing financial support of Humber Valley United Church that includes your support to current year programming and church operations, to capital funds and special

outreach projects.

Please continue to share your generosity in support of good stewardship. God gives it all and then calls us to share. Please also remember to continue your envelope givings if you're not attending church. Stewardship for the Church is managing its resources and stewardship individually for congregants is fulfilling our responsibilities to the Church to the best of our abilities.

Dominion Day — Canada Day

What we call *Canada Day* was originally called *Dominion Day*.

Sir Samuel Leonard Tilley was a Father of Confederation and a faithful Christian who read his bible and prayed upon waking each morning.

On the day the 33 Fathers of Confederation met to discuss what to name this new united Canada Tilley had read Psalm 72:8: "May He have dominion from sea to sea, and from the river to the ends of the earth!" and adamantly pushed for the Bible-inspired name *Dominion of Canada*. Sir John A. Macdonald's choice was *Kingdom of Canada*.

The other Fathers agreed to the term *Dominion* and to this day these words hang near the Confederation Chamber in Province House. In the hearts of the delegates that assembled in this room on Sept 1, 1864 was born *The Dominion of Canada*.

Upon Tilley's death in 1896, he wished to have these simple words inscribed on his tombstone: "His Trust was in Jesus".

Our country's name also reflects our native heritage. The word Canada is thought to be derived from the Saint-Lawrence Iroquoian word kanata for "settlement", "village", or "land". In choosing to name the country *Dominion of Canada*, the Fathers of Confederation drew upon their Christian heritage and combined it with the heritage of the people who already inhabited this land.


